### Presentation to be circulated

A collaboration between SCC, the University of Southampton and NquiringMinds has been successful in securing a place on <u>Innovate UK's Net Zero Living Pathfinder scheme</u> and has funding to undertake a feasibility study to develop detailed local plans for innovative approaches that unlock nontechnical systemic barriers to the delivery of net zero targets. The study is due to be submitted in 3 months and has the potential to unlock further funding for a delivery phase. As part of the project we would like to formally engage with members of the Climate Commission and are proposing to facilitate a workshop in May for this purpose. This will be a hybrid event and if you would like to participate there is an option to join remotely via Teams or in person at the Boldrewood Innovation Campus (Burgess Road, Southampton, SO16 7QF) where food and drink will be available. Phil Horton - One niche use would be range extenders for recreational boating. Our suggested carbon pathway for that industry suggests most would be battery electric, with a small number of hydrogen fuel cells. Similar to land transport
